WHY IS A DEVOTIONAL LIFE IMPORTANT?

Our personal relationship with God is more important than any other relationship we have. It can be harder to maintain, though, because two-way communication (the foundation for any healthy relationship) is a little more complicated with someone you can't text, call, message, write to, or FaceTime. God has chosen only one means of communication with his church today: the Bible. He *could* speak to us in any way he wants, and he is always with us even if we can't hear or see him, but he has already told us everything we need to know about him on this side of Heaven in his Word.

Our personal devotional life is how we spend time with God outside of what we call corporate worship (church services). Attending worship is definitely important to our relationship with God, but it's more like a group date. At some point, you need to spend time one-on-one, if you've been together for decades. Your devotional life is how you do that with God.

HOW DO I START?

Find a time that works for you and a resource that helps you connect with God's word. Like any habit, a regular time and place helps you stay with it. People do their devotions over their breakfast or morning coffee, on their lunch break, before bed. Depending on your resource, you may only need a few minutes and you might be able to listen to it as you drive to work. Family devotions are important too. We want our kids to
